The Mining and Minerals Bill, 2021: parliament has passed the Mining and Minerals Bill, 2021 which will see the establishment of the Uganda National Mining Company which will manage the government's commercial holding and participating interests in mineral agreements. Story

Thieves steal cables, poles for Karuma power project: the 600Mw Karuma Hydropower dam is unlikely to be commissioned for full operations by June 2022, the Parliamentary Committee on Environment and Natural Resources has said. The committee blamed this on the vandalism of some critical equipment of the plant including the electricity pylons. Story

<u>Govt terminates contract of Uganda Airlines CEO:</u> the decision was taken on Friday by the interim board. Works minister, Gen Edward Katumba Wamala suspended Muleya and 12 other top officials on April 21, 2021, on the orders of President Yoweri Museveni to pave way for investigations into allegations of financial mismanagement, collusion, and nepotism in staff recruitment among other issues. <u>Story</u>

Ethiopia's Renaissance Dam begins power generation; prime Minister Abiy Ahmed on Sunday officially inaugurated the first power generation of the mega-dam, dubbed Ethiopian Renaissance Dam, which is set to be the largest hydroelectric plant in Africa. Story
