<u>Halt use of smartphones in schools</u>; the ministry of Education and Sports has asked schools to halt the use of smartphones as teaching aids in schools. The state minister for Higher Education Dr John C. Muyingo issued the orders at a press briefing at the ministry of Education in Kampala Wednesday. <u>Story</u>

<u>Withdrawal from coffee body could affect dollar inflows</u>; the Central Bank has said the withdrawal of Uganda from the International Coffee agreement could impact importer sentiments due a reduction in dollar inflows in the market. <u>Story</u>
