<u>MPs reject proposal to contribute UGX 2M each towards Covid-19 vaccine</u> <u>purchase:</u> MPs have rejected a proposal to deduct UGX 2million salaries to support the procurement of COVID-19 vaccines. On Tuesday, Esther Afoyo-chan, a MPC proposed during plenary that each legislator contributes Shillings 2million million to help the government procure vaccines for learners between 2 and 18 years of age. <u>Story</u>

Rwanda protested the ban, saying the "arbitrary decision" by the UK does not "stand up to scientific scrutiny" given the country's strict enforcement of Covid-19 protocols. <u>Story</u>

<u>Govt starts distribution of Covid-19 vaccines</u>; Ms. Sheila Nduhukire, the spokesperson for NMS, said: "We are finalizing distribution of personal protective equipment for health workers, then we will start the process of dispatching vaccines across the country. By next week, districts shall have received their doses. <u>Story</u>

#### COURT;

**Chief Justice lifts ban on hearing cases and election petitions**; the Chief Justice Alfonse Owiny-Dollo has directed the resumption of the hearing of both criminal and civil matters under strict observance of the standard operating procedures aimed at stopping the spread of COVID-19. Justice Owiny-Dollo, who had also suspended the hearing of election petitions, has ordered those hearings resume on August 16, 2021, saying the Principal Judge will be issuing the schedules. <u>Story</u>

### SPORTS;

<u>Cheptegei, Kiplimo and Chelimo qualify for 5000m final in Tokyo Olympics</u>; Joshua Cheptegei, Jacob Kiplimo and Oscar Chelimo have all qualified to represent Uganda in the 5000m final. The three will now take part in the finals on Friday August 6. Chelimo was the first to secure his spot after finishing fourth in heat one posting 13:39.07 behind Kenya's Nicholas Kipkorir Kimeli who won the race in 13:38.87. <u>Story</u>
