And finally; Entebbe hospital runs out of Covid-19 vaccines; Entebbe Regional Referral hospital has run out of Covid-19 vaccine doses. Already 3,720 people have been vaccinated at the hospital. The hospital's vaccination exercise usually runs from 8 am to 5 pm every weekday. However, on Friday last week, the centre closed at 2 pm because there were less than five doses remaining and yet over ten people were waiting in queue to be vaccinated. Story
