Land Commission fails to account for land compensation for the past 18 months; the ULC is unable to give an account of people they have compensated for the last 18 months. This is after the Adhoc committee investigating land compensation tasked the Land Commission to provide a detailed list of the people they compensated overtime. #### **BUSINESS**:

**Gov't to levy tax on fish maw exports;** parliament has approved an eight per cent tax levy on fish maw exports following the passing of the Fish Bill, 2021. In a report to the House during a plenary sitting on 03 May 2021, the Vice Chairperson of the committee on Finance, Planning and Economic Development, Jane Avur Pacuto proposed a levy of Shs 70,000 per kgs of the fish maw. **Story**
