MTN to appeal Shs50.7b licence ruling; MTN has said it will appeal against the High Court decision in which it was ordered to pay money for a transitional licence amounting to \$14.4m (Shs50.7b). Story

<u>Uganda Cranes World Cup matches pushed to September</u>; World Soccer governing body FIFA has postponed Africa's World Cup qualifying games, to give time to countries to restore the right playing conditions. Games that had been set for June, have all been moved to September. Uganda was due to face Mali and Kenya next month. <u>Story</u>
