<u>32 judges to handle 155 parliamentary, LC election petitions;</u> the hearings for the parliamentary petitions which arose from the January 14, 2021, general elections, will start on August 16, 2021. <u>Story</u>

<u>Covid-19 spikes diabetes cases</u>; although most people with Covid-19 get better within weeks of illness, some people experience post-Covid conditions – a wide range of new, returning, or ongoing health problems that last four or more weeks after first being infected with the virus. <u>Story</u>

Stanbic half-year profits up 21.5% to Shs 154.9bn; the strong performance has largely been driven by Stanbic Bank Uganda Limited, the anchor subsidiary. The growth in Profit After Tax was mainly driven by strong growth in trade revenue accounting for Shs37.5 billion. Story
