Energy ministry, WWF construct solar power mini grids in remote Kasese; the panels with a total capacity of 170.625kW are in six villages of Kasese and Rubirizi Districts. They will supply power to 900 households and 205 small businesses in the two Sub Counties. Story

49 NUP supporters lose bid to block general court martial trial; Lady Justice Esta Nambayo dismissed the application on Tuesday afternoon on grounds that it lacks merit, saying the process leading to the arrest of the applicant and their subsequent prosecution in the military court was lawful. <u>Covid vaccine safe, says government</u>; Ugandan health experts yesterday assured citizens that the Oxford-AstraZeneca Covid-19 vaccine being administered in the country is safe, despite more than a dozen European and other states suspending its use. <u>Story</u>

BUSINESS;

<u>Uganda shilling appreciates by 1.2%</u>; the Ministry officials explain that the strengthening of the shilling during this period was supported by steady dollar inflows from offshore investors in the primary money market, export receipts and transfers to NGOs which outweighed the dollar demand. <u>Story</u>
