**Blessing for Nile Basin countries**; the reservoir has a storage capacity of 74 billion cubic meters. The primary objective of GERD is to generate electric power of 5150MW, with an annual average energy production of 15130GWH/year. ## COURT;

**Mother whose son was shot in mouth & killed in Nov riots sues govt**; Hajara Nakitto, the mother whose 15-year-old son was shot and killed during the November 2020 riots has sued the government, seeking compensation for the loss. Amos Ssegawa was shot dead on November 19, 2020, as the police and army violently quelled protests that followed the arrest of then-presidential candidate Robert Kyagulanyi Ssentamu during a campaign rally in Luke district. <u>Story</u>

Medical association ponders legal action over mandatory COVID-19 jabs for <u>health workers</u>; even as less than 50 per cent of the targeted 150,000 health workers have sought their jabs, Idro says that threatening abstaining health workers with pay cuts and suspension will only heighten the anxiety among the population.
