<u>Oil demand set to exceed pre-pandemic levels in 2022</u>; oil demand is set to rise above pre-pandemic levels by the end of next year, but producers have sufficient capacity rise to the challenge. In its first detailed look at next year in its regular monthly review of the oil market, the IEA sees a gradual return of demand as vaccine distribution widens and economic activity returns to normal in many countries and sectors.
