NATIONAL;

<u>Uganda's domestic debt breaks 50% of GDP ceiling:</u> the government has acknowledged that it has broken its own domestic debt ceiling to a level which it calls "unhealthy domestic borrowing." The amount of debt that the government has acquired from the domestic market has gone up to Shs 6.8 trillion which is more than 1 per cent of Product GDP, initially set as the maximum. <u>Story</u>

<u>Murder cases top criminal appeals list</u>; Murder cases have dominated the list as the Court of Appeal is set to hear 40 criminal appeals in the next two weeks. Court of Appeal judges Kenneth Kakuru, Muzamiru Kibeedi and Irene Mulyagonja will hear the cases. <u>Story</u>

<u>USAID injects Shs27b in TB programme</u>; USAID has injected \$7.5m in Karamoja Sub-region to address high tuberculosis prevalence and low treatment success rates in the area. <u>Story</u>

<u>UCC unable to license new TVs as signet runs out of space</u>; the delay to embark on Phase three of the Digital Terrestrial Television network has forced the Uganda Communications Commission to stop issuing licenses to new broadcasters. <u>Story</u>
