Govt to block essential workers without electronic travel permits; essential workers without electronic permits issued by the Ministry of Works and Transport will not be allowed on the roads today. Read More

But if we are giving a booster [second] dose, the few who are getting it will have better protection, but it will not help us as a country in fighting the epidemic. Read More

<u>Parents ask gov't to use Community Stations for radio lessons</u>; parents in the greater Ankole region have asked the government to consider utilizing radio stations from the respective districts to ensure continuity of learning as schools remain closed. Read More

BUSINESS:

Shippers seek redress from regional court over SGR use; Ugandan shippers want their Kenyan counterparts to join them in seeking redress from regional courts to allow them to choose their preferred mode of transport for cargo from Mombasa Port. Read More

And finally; Entebbe hospital staff in panic as ten medics battle Covid-19; medical workers at Entebbe Regional Referral Hospital are in panic after ten other medics contracted COVID-19 while on duty. The ten medics have been on treatment for three weeks now, putting a toll on the facility which has more than 130 patients, 48 of them in critical condition. Read More
