Ugandans in Afghanistan rejected proposal to be evacuated; the Minister of Foreign Affairs Gen. Jeje Odongo has said that despite calls to evacuate Ugandans trapped in Afghanistan, some of them refused to leave the Middle East country. Story

New COVID-19 variant detected in South Africa; the country's National Institute for Communicable Diseases announced in a new study that the variant, which has been designated C.1.2, was first detected in South Africa in May of this year and has since spread to seven other countries in Africa, Asia, Europe and the southern Pacific region of Oceania. Defense lawyer asks state to drop charges against suspects; the lawyer of the eight suspects charged with the attempted murder of Gen. Edward Katumba Wamala has asked the state to drop the charges against his clients, saying that they are not responsible for the crime they are facing. Story

HEALTH:

Slow vaccination in districts threatens schools reopening; some districts have not yet started Covid-19 vaccination using the Chinese-made Sinovac vaccines that the government has ring-fenced for teachers. Story

BUSINESS:
