Parliament passes NSSF bill, okays mid-term access; parliament has today considered and passed the NSSF Bill, 2021. The bill that allows 20% mid-term access for workers who have saved for over 10 years and have reached the age of 45, now awaits presidential consent. Story

Why MTN Uganda's IPO has failed to beat its target; the company was expected to collect \$250 million from the IPO, but there are indications that the figure will be far below that target. Ultimately, MTN's performance was hurt by a cocktail of factors, both internal and external. Story

Govt faulted on failed construction on Akii-Bua and Buhinga stadium; legislators on the Committee on Education were left in shock after they discovered that a US\$113 million grant from the Chinese government for construction of Buhinga and Akii-Bua stadia has not been utilized. Story

And finally; Land Commission 'not sure' how they gave away Railways' land; officials from the ULC struggled to explain how they allocated more acreage of URC land in Nsambya to investors than what was approved by the cabinet.
