Parliament has described the agreement as illegal and demanded that "officials who committed Government to such illegalities should be penalized as a deterrent mechanism to stop similar occurrences in future." <u>Story</u>

Bugisu MPs want one-stop border post; members of Parliament in Bugisu Sub-region have asked government to establish a one-stop border post at Lwakhakha in Namisindwa District to boost trade and increase the country's export base. <u>Story</u>
